Reginald retired from the Oklahoma Department of Corrections after thirty-eight (38) years of dedicated service. Throughout his career, he held numerous leadership positions, including Superintendent of Clara Waters Community Corrections Center; Warden at both the Jess Dunn and Lexington Correctional Facilities; and Deputy Director over the Division of Community Corrections. In his role as Deputy Director, he oversaw statewide operations for Probation and Parole, Halfway Houses, Community Corrections Facilities, the Interstate Compact, and Reintegration Services.

Following his retirement from the Department of Corrections, Mr. Hines continued his commitment to public service by working with juveniles as a Facility Administrator, supervising detention centers in Cleveland and Oklahoma Counties.

Mr. Hines serves on several boards and holds multiple leadership roles, including President of the Oklahoma Chapter of the National Association of Blacks in Criminal Justice; President of the Board for Working Together for Change Prison Ministry; Vice President of Programs for Plight Society Jazz and the STARR Foundation; and Board Member of S.O.A.R. (Supporting Oklahoma Offenders in Achieving Reintegration). He is also a past President and Board Member of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI). Additionally, he served on the Justice Roundtable Committee in Washington, D.C., advocating for sentencing reform related to the powder versus crack cocaine disparity.

Mr. Hines is a Certified Auditor for the American Correctional Association and is a graduate of Leadership Oklahoma, Class XXVIII (28).
